
We would like to thank our Patrons for their continued support at our productions and hope that you all take advantage of priority booking available exclusively to you.

Treasurer's Report

What a fantastic show Me and My Girl proved to be. It was a joy to see so many smiley faces as the audience members left the auditorium. The Committee had made the decision to keep seat prices low to enable us to attract a large audience. Seat prices for the Monday and Tuesday performance were all sold at £9, the rest of the week at £12 with concessions at £10; the take up on seats did improve on OKLAHOMA! It was 65% for OKLAHOMA! 74% on Me and My Girl. However, with a production cost of over £22,000 (wardrobe costs were high, but the costumes were brilliant and certainly made the show) at the end of the day the loss will be around &5,000. Thank goodness for the Pantomime and Calendar Girls. In the ten years that I have been the treasurer we have only once come out with a profit and that was for Pirates of Penzance. Realistically the ticket price for this year's Autumn Musical will have to be increased to reflect the true costings of a lavish show.

Nicky Rowe and Joanne Quirke continue to beaver away as part of the financial team. A big thank you to both of them.

Our membership numbers continue to show a gradual increase. The cast for Show White included some new members which was a very pleasing sight, showing that there is still a very healthy interest in our Company.

We are still in need of show sponsors so if you know of anybody who may be interested please let me or another member of the Committee know.

Our quiz evening was a great success with 32 people attending and we made a profit of £92.50!

BLACKADDER COESFORTH

On Remembrance Weekend in November we held auditions for our Spring Play, Blackadder Goes Forth, and the Audition Panel had a thoroughly enjoyable time choosing the cast. We were treated to some excellent performances that made us laugh out loud (for all the right reasons!) and I was personally delighted to see some fierce competition for parts. Although this made the casting process difficult I think it has resulted in a wonderful list of players which is a good blend of newcomers, long-term members and returning past-members, all of whom I am sure will together deliver a production to be proud of in March 2014;

The script has been adapted for the stage from the world-famous and well-loved BBC television comedy series written by Richard Curtis and Ben Elton and it has not lost any of its appeal over the last twenty-or-so years since it originally aired in 1989. The laughs are thick and fast through three selected episodes ('Major Star', 'General Hospital' and 'Goodbyeee') but it also promotes an underlying respect for the ferocity of the Great War and the sacrifices of the men that fought in it. We therefore hope this production will serve as a light-hearted and yet poignant tribute to mark the centenary year of the start of the Great War.

I met with the Cast in the week immediately after the Auditions for one preliminary read-through and there was a definite excitement amongst them about their involvement in this production. They are keen to embrace this fantastic and rare opportunity to play some of the most memorable characters in television comedy history and reap the rewards of bringing them to life on stage in front of a live audience.

By the time you read this Panto will have been put to bed and our Blackadder rehearsals will have begun in earnest. To say that I have been eager to get cracking would be an understatement... In the words of Lieutenant The Honourable George Colthurst St. Barleigh;

Lemon and Poppyseed Cupcakes

Ingredients

225g self-raising flour
175g golden caster sugar
zest 2 lemons
1 tbsp poppy seeds, toasted
3 eggs
100g natural yogurt
175g butter, melted and cooled a little
For the icing
225g butter, softened
400g icing sugar, sifted
juice 1 lemon
few drops yellow food colouring
icing flowers or yellow sprinkles, to decorate

Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line a 12-hole muffin tin with cupcake or muffin cases. Mix the flour, sugar, lemon zest and poppy seeds together in a large mixing bowl. Beat the eggs into the yogurt, then tip this into the dry ingredients with the melted butter. Mix together with a wooden spoon or whisk until lump-free, then divide between the cases. Bake for 20-22 mins until a skewer poked in comes out clean – the cakes will be quite pale on top still. Cool for 5 mins in the tin, then carefully lift onto a wire rack to finish cooling.

To ice, beat the softened butter until really soft in a large bowl, then gradually beat in the icing sugar and lemon juice. Stir in enough food colouring for a pale lemon colour, then spoon the icing into a piping bag with a large star nozzle.

Ice one cake at a time, holding the piping bag almost upright with the nozzle about 1cm from the surface of the cake. Pipe one spiral of icing around the edge, then pause to break the flow before moving the nozzle towards the centre slightly and piping a second, smaller spiral that continues until there are no gaps in the centre.

Slightly 'dot' the nozzle into the icing as you stop squeezing to finish neatly. Repeat to cover all the cakes, then top with sugar decorations or scatter with sprinkles.

Apart from being enormous fun, and most recently setting a trend for bringing a few nibbles and fizzy so it's a marvellous atmosphere in congenial company!




